

Tab Partners with Oak Street Health

Tabernacle Baptist Church is proud to announce that it has established an official partnership with Oak Street Health. It is highly anticipated that this relationship will result in access to resources that encourage healthy living and routine medical care for our senior population. Already, Oak Street Health participated at Tab's "Bring-A-Chair...Bring-A-Lunch" event that was held recently where members were encouraged to come fellowship and eat with one another. The event was an outdoor event held in the parking lot of Tabernacle Baptist Church. Attendees were required to wear masks and practice proper social distancing. Oak Street Health provided medical and program information, snacks, drinks, and games. The event was successful and approximately 40 people attended.

In addition, Oak Street Health selected Tab as the site for their "Fall Festival". This event was held October 15, 2020. This is an event that included a host of information, vendors, food, music, games, fellowship, and giveaways—all of which were catered to the senior citizen population. We are looking forward to working with Oak Street Health.

Sanctuary Worship

Many of you have been anxiously awaiting an update regarding when we might be able to gather again in the sanctuary. Some of you are also very much aware that a few weeks ago we announced that we would attempt to resume "in-person" services on October 25, 2020. However, with the shift in diagnoses, we have opted to amend our plans.

As it stands, we are planning on holding service in the sanctuary one time per month for the remainder of 2020. Services are currently scheduled for 10/25/2020, 11/22/2020, and 12/20/2020. Please note that these dates are not guaranteed, but rather anticipated. All persons that are a part of the vulnerable population (i.e. weakened immune systems, elderly, individuals with respiratory conditions, etc.) will be encouraged to abstain from worship service until deemed absolutely safe. Attendees will be required to wear masks at all times, submit to temperature checks, practice social distancing, sit where assigned, and follow all instructions as given.

Of course, there will be those of you that may not agree with this course of action. Yet, there are others that are upset that we're only gathering one time per month for the remainder of the year and not on a weekly basis. Regardless, we are all experimenting and simply trying to do God's will in the middle of the pandemic.

Our Building

Over the course of the last few months, we have been in a constant state of preparation in anticipation of resuming regularly scheduled events at Tabernacle—considering all that must occur in order for our facility to be considered COVID-19 compliant. We've taken the opportunity to place hand sanitizer and disinfectant spray strategically throughout the entire building. In addition, seating has been marked and floor signs placed—encouraging proper social distancing throughout the church.

While safety precautions have certainly been taken with regard to the building, we have also instituted and enforced the wearing of masks by everyone who enters the building. Of course, this is for the sake of everyone's safety and well-being. Other portions of the building have been deemed "restricted"—as we enforce efforts that will prayerfully assist in eliminating potential contamination.

Please note that we have done everything possible to take advantage of the seemingly vacant building—constantly preparing for the return of Tab. All floors have been stripped and waxed, the entrance foyer by the office and the education wing hallway has been repainted, and beautification efforts of the edifice continue—as we prepare to return to our regular schedule.

Of course, these efforts have not been easy and have come with their share of challenges. Repairmen have been summoned to assist with plumbing issues, and we also discovered a few structural issues that resulted in us having to repair to avoid prospective encounters with wild life, as we had when a raccoon tried to join us for worship (the wildlife issue has since been addressed).

All in all, the time that the building has been without regular use has allowed us to be able to address some of that items that had been overlooked in

the day-to-day routine of ministry. With your continued prayers and financial support, we can ensure that Tabernacle Baptist Church remains an essential part of the Youngstown community for many years to come.

A large raccoon got into the ceiling and fell through onto one of the classrooms and made a horrible mess that had to be cleaned up. The raccoon entered from the roof through a place where the wood has been rotting over the years. This is what has been causing the leaking in the ceiling in the Covington Street entrance. We will have more information in the coming weeks on how the leak will be taken care of after the next Trustee Meeting.

Although Women's Day was in May some of our members were not aware they can still send their \$50.00 assessment if they have not already done so.
